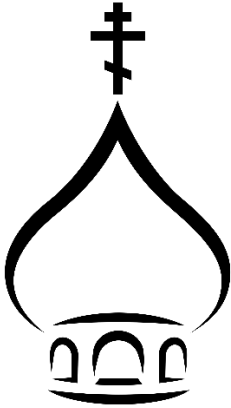

Psalm 104

Praise the LORD, O my soul. O LORD my God, you have become exceedingly glorious; you are clothed with majesty and honor. You clothe yourself with light as with a garment, and spread out the heavens like a curtain. You lay the beams of your chambers in the waters, and make the clouds your chariot, and walk upon the wings of the wind. You make winds your messengers, and flames of fire your ministers. You laid the foundations of the earth, that it never should move at any time. You cover it with the deep as with a garment; the waters stand above the hills. At your rebuke they fled; at the voice of your thunder they hastened away. They went up as high as the hills, and down to the valleys beneath, even to the place you had appointed for them. You have set bounds for them which they shall not pass; neither shall they again cover the earth. You send the springs into the rivers, which run among the hills. All beasts of the field drink thereof, and the wild donkeys quench their thirst. Beside them shall the birds of the air have their habitation and sing among the branches. You water the hills from above; the earth is filled with the fruit of your works. You bring forth grass for the cattle, and plants for the service of mankind, That they may bring food out of the earth, and wine that makes glad the heart, and oil to make a cheerful countenance, and bread to strengthen the heart. The trees of the LORD also are full of sap, even the cedars of Lebanon which he planted, Wherein the birds make their nests, and the fir trees are a dwelling for the stork. The high hills are a refuge for the wild goats, and so are the stony cliffs for the rock badgers. You appointed the moon to mark the seasons, and the sun knows its going down. You make darkness that it may be night, in which all the beasts of the forest move.

The lions, roaring after their prey, seek their meat from God. The sun arises, and they go away together, and lay themselves down in their dens. Man goes forth to his work, and to his labor until the evening. O LORD, how manifold are your works; in wisdom you made them all; the earth is full of your creatures.

So is the great and wide sea also, in which are things creeping innumerable, creatures both small and great. There go the ships, and there is that Leviathan, whom you made to take its pleasure therein. These all wait upon you, that you may give them food in due season. When you give it to them, they gather it, and when you open your hand, they are filled with good things. When you hide your face, they are troubled; when you take away their breath, they die, and are turned again to their dust.

When you let your breath go forth, they shall be made, and you shall renew the face of the earth. The glorious majesty of the LORD shall endure for ever; the LORD shall rejoice in his works. He looks at the earth and it trembles; if he even touches the hills, they shall smoke. I will sing unto the LORD as long as I live; I will praise my God while I have my being, And so shall my words please him; my joy shall be in the LORD. As for sinners, they shall perish from the earth, and the ungodly shall come to an end. Praise the LORD, O my soul. Praise the LORD.

Great Litany

The regular petitions are not intoned, instead:

Lord, have mercy! (12) Through the prayers of our holy fathers, O Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy on us. (Amen.)

Lord, I Call

(Tone 4) Lord I call upon Thee, hear me! Hear me, O Lord! Lord, I call upon Thee, hear me! Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon Thee, hear me O Lord! Let my prayer arise, in Thy sight as incense, and let the lifting up of my hands, be an evening sacrifice, hear me O Lord!

6. If thou, Lord, shouldest mark iniquities, O Lord, who shall stand? But there is forgiveness with thee.

Thou hast traversed the narrow path with untroubled spirit, sailing to those things that lead to life: for thou hast been the boast of them that fast, O Euthymius, having, steadfastly, set at naught the pursuit of the devils: wherefore, thou hast been counted worthy to be an heir to the heavenly kingdom, and delightest in never-ending beauty.

5. For thy name's sake have I patiently waited for thee, O Lord; my soul hath waited patiently for thy word: My soul hath hoped in the Lord.

Thy most-radiant life astonished the angels, and, manifestly, affrighted the savage devils: thou hast, splendidly, adorned the assemblies of the faithful, ever commanding them to go to the heavenly dwelling-place of Christ: pray to Him, that they be delivered, from corruption and misfortunes, that celebrate, with faith, thine all-honoured memory.

4. From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch: Let Israel hope in the Lord.

Hymnody and praise hast thou brought to Christ every day, O father, whilst dwelling in the desert; and, offering up thy soul, and mind, to the one God, like the great Moses, thou hast ascended to the impassable heights of sanctity: wherefore, having vanquished the invisible foe, thou hast become, both, a pure habitation, and an instrument of the divine Spirit.

3. For with the Lord, there is mercy; and, with Him, is plenteous redemption: And He shall redeem Israel from all his iniquities.

(Tone 4) With discourse of the word of God, enriching them in faith, thou hast made the faithful steadfast, that they might, boldly, endure the rage of the tyrant, for the sake of the life that is to come, and incorruptible joy: wherefore, we call thee blessed, O right-glorious Lucian, and celebrate, today, thy godly solemnity.

2. O praise the Lord, all ye nations: Praise Him, all ye people.

Lengthy imprisonment, and a most-violent death, hast thou endured, O venerable one, being bound with bonds, and lacerated with sharp-edged shards, O blessed one, and weakened by cruel starvation, and by long thirst: wherefore, thou hast, manifestly, received heavenly food, as an invincible martyr, O valiant athlete.

1. For His merciful kindness is great towards us: And the truth of the Lord endureth forever.

The bosom of the sea, receiving thee, O glorious one, gaveth thee over to the dry land after thirty days, like Jonah of old, through the service of wild beasts, for godly-honourable burial, and a godly well-spring of healings, princely election of martyrs, establishment of the Church, intercession for our souls, O thou God-bearer most-rich.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

(Tone 6) O venerable father, throughout all the earth, thy preaching of correction hath gone forth; wherefore, in the heavens, hast thou found the reward for thy labours: thou hast quelled the hosts of the devils, and hast reached the orders of the angels, unto whose unspotted life thou hast attained: having boldness before Christ God, ask thou peace for our souls.

Now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Envyng thy flock, O all-pure one, the wicked adversary ever striveth to make it his food; but, O The-o-to-kos, de-liv-er us from his harm.

Wisdom! Let us attend!

Gladsome Light

O Gladsome Light of the holy glory of the immortal Father, heavenly, holy, blessed, O Jesus Christ! Now that we have come to the setting of the sun, and behold the light of evening, we praise God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit! For meet it is at all times to worship Thee with voices of praise O Son of God, and Giver of Life. Therefore all the world doth glorify Thee!

Evening Prokeimenon

Wisdom! Let us Attend! The Prokeimenon in the 5th tone: Save me, O God, by Thy name and judge me by Thy strength!

Verse: Hear my prayer, O God, hearken to the words of my mouth!

Vouchsafe, O Lord

Vouchsafe, O Lord, to keep us this night without sin. Blessed art Thou, O Lord, the God of our fathers, and praised and glorified is Thy Name forever. Amen. Let Thy mercy be upon us, O Lord, even as we have set our hope on Thee. Blessed art Thou, O Lord, teach me Thy statutes! Blessed art Thou, O Master, make me to understand Thy statutes! Blessed art Thou, O Holy One, enlighten me with Thy statutes! Thy mercy, O Lord, endureth forever. O despise not the works of Thy hands. To Thee belongeth worship, to Thee belongeth praise, to Thee belongeth glory: to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen

Litany of Supplication

The regular petitions are not intoned, instead:

Aposticha

(Tone 1) The harmonious harp of the apostles, played by the Holy Spirit, abolished the abominable sacrifices of the demons; and, proclaiming the one Lord, it hath delivered the nations from the deception of the idols, and taught them to worship the consubstantial Trinity.

*Unto thee lift I up mine eyes, O thou that dwellest in the heavens. Behold, as the eyes of servants look unto the hand of their masters, and as the eyes of a maiden unto the hand of her mistress; even so our eyes wait upon the Lord our God: * Until He have mercy upon us.*

Together, let us praise Peter and Paul, Luke and Matthew, Mark and John, Andrew and Thomas, Bartholomew and Simon the Canaïte, James and Philip; and let us laud the whole choir of the disciples, as is meet.

Have mercy upon us, O Lord, have mercy upon us, for we are exceedingly filled with contempt. Our soul is exceedingly filled with humiliation; let reproach come upon the wealthy: abasement on the proud.

O all-praised martyrs, the earth hid you not; but heaven received you; the gates of paradise were opened to you: and, having entered within, ye delight in the tree of life; O pray to Christ, that He may grant our souls peace and great mercy.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,

(Tone 5) O venerable father, thou hast given no sleep to thine eyes, nor slumber to thine eyelids, until thou hadst freed thy soul and body from the passions, and hadst prepared thyself as an habitation of the Spirit: for Christ, coming, with the Father, made His dwelling within thee, and thou becamest a favourite of the consubstantial Trinity; O great-preacher Euthymius, pray for our souls.

Now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

(Tone 8) In thee, O father, was plainly saved, that which is after the image: for, taking up the cross, thou hast followed after Christ, and, in so doing, hast taught us to spurn the flesh, for it passeth away, but to look to the soul, as a thing immortal: where-fore now, together with the angels, O venerable Euthymius, thy soul rejoiceth.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

(Tone 4) Thy martyr Lucian, O Lord, through his sufferings, won an incorruptible crown from Thee, our God: for, having Thy strength, he laid low the tormentors, and dashed to pieces the infirm boldness of the devils; at his prayers, save Thou our souls.

Now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

(Tone 4) The Word of the Father, even Christ our God, Who was truly incarnate of thee, have we come to know, O Virgin Theotokos, who alone art pure, who alone art blessed: wherefore, we unceasingly magnify thee in song.
