You lay the beams of your chambers in the waters, and make the clouds your chariot, and walk upon the wings of the wind. You make winds your messengers, and flames of fire your ministers. You laid the foundations of the earth, that it never should move at any time. You cover it with the deep as with a garment; the waters stand above the hills. At your rebuke they fled; at the voice of your thunder they hastened away. They went up as high as the hills, and down to the valleys beneath, even to the place you had appointed for them. You have set bounds for them which they shall not pass; neither shall they again cover the earth. You send the springs into the rivers, which run among the hills. All beasts of the field drink thereof, and the wild donkeys quench their thirst. Beside them shall the birds of the air have their habitation and sing among the branches. You water the hills from above; the earth is filled with the fruit of your works. You bring forth grass for the cattle, and plants for the service of mankind, That they may bring food out of the earth, and wine that makes glad the heart, and oil to make a cheerful countenance, and bread to strengthen the heart. The trees of the LORD also are full of sap, even the cedars of Lebanon which he planted, Wherein the birds make their nests, and the fir trees are a dwelling for the stork. The high hills are a refuge for the wild goats, and so are the stony cliffs for the rock badgers. You appointed the moon to mark the seasons, and the sun knows its going down. You make darkness that it may be night, in which all the beasts of the forest move. The lions, roaring after their prey, seek their meat from God. The

sun arises, and they go away together, and lay themselves down in their dens. Man goes forth to his work, and to his labor until the evening. O LORD, how manifold are your works; in wisdom you made them all; the earth is full of your creatures. So is the great and wide sea also, in which are things creeping innumerable, creatures both small and great. There go the ships, and there is that Leviathan, whom you made to take its pleasure therein. These all wait upon you, that you may give them food in due season. When you give it to them, they gather it, and when you open your hand, they are filled with good things. When you hide your face, they are troubled; when you take away their breath, they die, and are turned again to their dust. When you let your breath go forth, they shall be made, and you shall renew the face of the earth. The glorious majesty of the LORD shall endure for ever; the LORD shall rejoice in his works. He looks at the earth and it trembles; if he even touches the hills, they shall smoke. I will sing unto the LORD as long as I live; I will praise my God while I have my being, And so shall my words please him; my joy shall be in the LORD. As for sinners, they shall perish from the earth, and the ungodly shall come to an end. Praise the LORD, O my soul. Praise the LORD.

Great Litany

The regular petitions are not intoned, instead: Lord, have mercy! (12) Through the prayers of our holy fathers, O Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy on us. (Amen.)

Lord, I Call

(Tone 2) Lord I call upon Thee, hear me! Hear me, O Lord! Lord, I call upon Thee, hear me! Receive the voice of my prayer, when I call upon Thee, hear me O Lord! Let my prayer arise, in Thy sight as incense, and let the lifting up of my hands, be an evening sacrifice, hear me O Lord!

6. If thou, Lord, shouldest mark iniquities, O Lord, who shall stand? But there is forgiveness with thee.

Our Light that enlightens all comes to be baptized. The Forerunner sees Him and rejoices in His soul. His hand trembles as he shows Him to the people: "Behold, the Redeemer of Israel, the One Who frees us from corruption." O sinless One, Christ our God, glory to Thee!

5. For thy name's sake have I patiently waited for thee, O Lord; my soul hath waited patiently for thy word: My soul hath hoped in the Lord.

A servant baptized our Redeemer and the coming of the Spirit bore witness to Him. The hosts of Angels saw this and shook with fear. And the voice of the Father was heard from heaven: "The One on Whom the Forerunner lays his hand, He is My beloved Son; I am well pleased in Him." O Christ our God, glory to Thee!

4. From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch: Let Israel hope in the Lord.

The streams of the Jordan received Thee, their source, and the Comforter descended in the form of a dove. He Who bowed the heavens now bows His head. The Clay cries aloud to the Potter: "Why dost thou command me to do what is beyond me; for I rather should be baptized by Thee." O sinless One, Christ our God, glory to thee!

3. For with the Lord, there is mercy; and, with Him, is plenteous redemption: And He shall redeem Israel from all his iniquities.

When the Forerunner beheld Thee, O Christ, drawing near to him to ask for baptism, he cried out in trembling: "Why dost Thou ask me for what is beyond my strength? How shall I touch Thee with my hand, O all-powerful Lord, for Thou holdest all things with Thy hand? But instead baptize me, Thy servant!"

2. O praise the Lord, all ye nations: Praise Him, all ye people.

"This day have I appeared as a complete Man; unapproachable by nature, I have become approachable to thee. Rich, I have willingly made Myself poor, that what has grown poor I may make rich with incorruption and deliverance. Draw near

and baptize Him Who is not subject to corruption, and Who delivers the world from decay!"

1. For His merciful kindness is great towards us: And the truth of the Lord endureth forever.

"I am constrained on every side," said the Forerunner to the Creator, "and cannot tell which way to go. Bountiful Lord, Thou art a stream flowing with nourishment; how then shall the flowing streams receive Thee, O Word, Who come to pour forth salvation on all who honor Thy holy Epiphany!"

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

(Tone 6) Light in the flesh and Forerunner of the Savior, offspring of a barren mother, and friend of Him Who was born of a Virgin, thou hast worshipped Him by leaping in the womb, and hast baptized Him in the waters of the Jordan. We entreat thee to intercede with Him, O Prophet, that we may escape from the mighty tempests to come!

Now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

(Tone 6) God the Word shone forth in the flesh to the human race. He stood waiting to be baptized in the Jordan. And the Forerunner said to Him: "How can my hand touch the head which rules all things? Though Thou art the child of Mary, yet I know that Thou art God before the ages. Thou art hymned by the Seraphim, yet Thou walkest on earth. And I a servant have not learned how to baptize the Master. O Lord past understanding, glory to thee."

Vouchsafe, O Lord, to keep us this night without sin. Blessed art Thou, O Lord, the God of our fathers, and praised and glorified is Thy Name forever. Amen. Let Thy mercy be upon us, O Lord, even as we have set our hope on Thee. Blessed art Thou, O Lord, teach me Thy statutes! Blessed art Thou, O Master, make me to understand Thy statutes! Blessed art Thou, O Holy One, enlighten me with Thy statutes! Thy mercy, O Lord, endureth forever. O despise not the works of Thy hands. To Thee belongeth worship, to Thee belongeth praise, to Thee belongeth glory: to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen

Aposticha

When he saw Thee draw near to him, O Master, John the Forerunner was amazed, and as a faithful servant he cried out in fear: "O Savior, what is this humility? What is this poverty Thou hast put on? In the wealth of Thy goodness and compassion, Thou hast raised up man from his humiliation, by clothing Thyself in him!"

The sea looked and fled; Jordan turned back.

"Come to me this day," the Savior of all replied to the Forerunner, "for I bring to pass a mystery. Serve me with trembling, yet do not draw back in fear. For, undefiled by nature, I stand now before thee in the waters of the Jordan and am baptized as Man: I renew Adam, who was shattered by sin."

What aileth thee, O thou sea, that thou fleddest? Thou Jordan, that thou didst turn back?

"Who among men," replied John, "has seen the Sun being cleansed, and Him Who covered the heaven with clouds stripped naked? Who has seen Him Who made the springs and rivers, Himself enter the waters? I stand amazed at Thine ineffable dispensation, O Master. Do not burden Thy servant with fearful commands!"

"Glory" in the 4th Tone: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

As the lover of the Spirit, the swallow that brings divine tidings of grace, O Forerunner, thou hast made known clearly to mankind the dispensation of the King, Who shone forth in brightness from a pure Virgin for the restoration of man. Thou dost banish the dominion of dark and evil ways, guiding the hearts of those baptized in repentance to eternal life, O blessed Prophet inspired by God! "

Now and ever" in the same tone: Now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Let us imitate the wise virgins, let us go and meet the Master Who appears; like a bridegroom He comes forth to John. Seeing Thee, the Jordan holds back in fear. John cries out: "I dare not hold Thine immortal head!" The Spirit comes down in the form of a dove to sanctify the waters. And a voice from heaven resounds: "This is My Son, Who comes to the world to save the human race." O Lord, glory to thee!

After suffering with joy on behalf of the truth, thou didst proclaim even to those in hell the God Who appeared in the flesh, Who takes away the sin of the world and grants us great mercy!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

(Tone 1) When Thou, O Lord, wast baptized in the Jordan, the worship of the Trinity was made manifest. For the voice of the Father bore witness to Thee, and called Thee His beloved Son; and the Spirit in the form of a dove confirmed the truthfulness of His word.
